Area 3: Material (or Type of Publication) Specific Details

At this writing, four kinds of materials require use of Area 3: maps and other cartographic materials, printed music, electronic resources, and serials in all physical formats. Each of these types of material has its own information for this area, hence the name *material specific*. For maps and other cartographic items, the scale and, when found on the item, the projection and, optionally, a statement of coordinates and equinox are given; for music, the musical presentation; for electronic resources, when such information is readily available, the type of file and information relating to the number and size of files (for most items, this information is available only for files housed in a computer at a remote site, called "remote access" files); and for serials, the numbering of the first volume. Figures 4.13 through 4.16 illustrate the use of Area 3 for materials that require it.

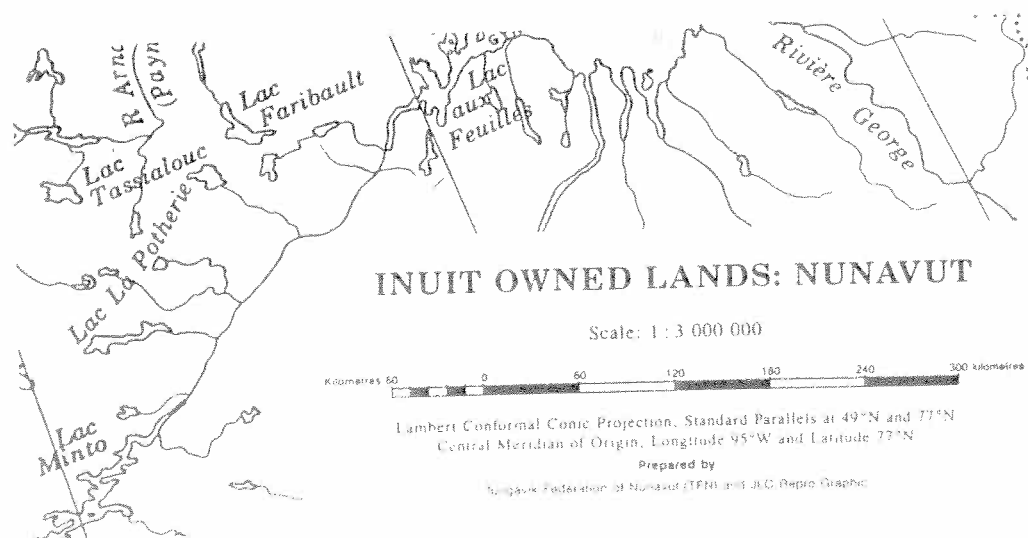

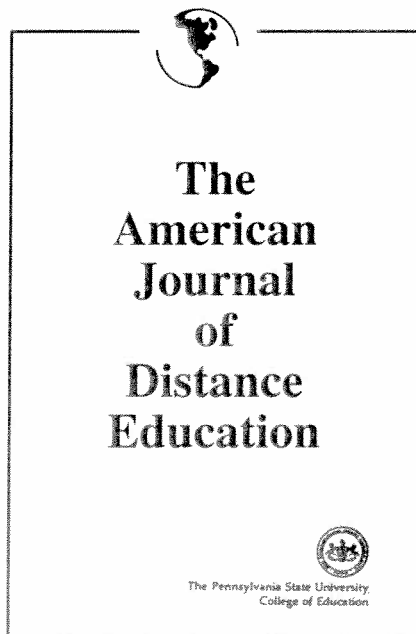
